The NSS Units 185 & 186 of RSM SNDP Yogam Arts and Science College, Koyilandy is a magnificent that has 100 newly enrolled volunteers every year. Right from the beginning this unit was steered by very dynamic and diplomatic programme officers. The multiple challenging activities taken up by the unit has paved the path to success and self-utilization for many of our volunteers. The various activities taken up has equipped our volunteers with responsibility, leadership qualities, organisational activities abilities and a sense of communal harmony in social and communal relations.

During this periods as NSS Programme Officers we stood as a catalyst to get the volunteers participate and organise various NSS activities. The most remarkable activities taken up under our guidance include the construction of a 'Mango Park' in the college campus. In this project our volunteers planted around 50 special varieties of mango plants. We also extreme pleased to share the experience of having constructed a 'Chendumalli' garden in the month of June 2015. This activity ensured the participation of all the volunteers effectively. We proud to say that the students took a lot of effort to plant more than 2000 chendumalli saplings in the front of the campus. Our effort blossomed resulting in the harvest of sale of flowers in the month of August, the time we celebrate the festival of flowers, Onam. Both these highly appended activities were done in association with the agricultural Dept, Krishibhavan Koyilandy, as a part of protecting our natural water resources, we were able to motivate the volunteers to take part in the 'Mazhayulsavam' programme organized in collaboration with the Koyilandy Municipality. In this project, our volunteers planted 'Ramacham' around the Kollam Chira (Pond) to cleans the water.



Our most highlighted and much appreciated activity is the launch of our Novel venture 'Adithyam'. We extremely pleased to say that I initiated this activity which is the first of its kind in the history of our college. As per this work, we provide food on all Fridays to the needy people starving in the streets. I tune with the Motto of NSS "Not Me But You". We have been able to inspire our students to carry an extra pack of lunch in rotation on Fridays. This programme has been a success and we continue it till date.

As part of our duty as NSS Programme Officers we have been able to inculcate in the young minds the value of Organic Farming. We introduced organic farming in the campus by cultivating various items like tomatoes, green chillies, brinjal, cabbage etc. in 300 grow bags. In this programme we utilized innovative garden technologies including rain shelter and drip irrigation facility to effectively employ our water resource.

In our campus we have been able to organise two blood donation camps with the dedicated service of our volunteers. Blood donation Camps were done by joining hands with the Govt. Hospital, Koyilandy & Govt. Women and Child Care Hospital, Kottaparambu. This programme enabled me to address the knowledge, attitude and behaviour of the students in the areas of Voluntary Blood Donation. Our dedicated energetic volunteers are always available in the case of emergencies. Many of our volunteers are donating blood in specific intervals regularly and in emergency.

In par with all the novel ventures and motivational activities taken up by this NSS Unit, as Programme Officer, We extremely proud to declare that one of our NSS Volunteer, Reethal K Raman participated in the South Zone Pre Republic Day Parade Camp conducted by the Regional Directorate of NSS conducted by the Regional Directorate of NSS, Chennai and another volunteer, Anaina P. S, participated in the 7 day National Integration Camp at Belgaum Karnataka.

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



Rallies & Street Plays






Through the magazine



These interactions enabled us to get a lot of information about the place, its peculiarities and specialities. Especially the woman folk of the place shared with us certain sensitive issues prevailing in the place. After the survey, we analysed the data and prepared a report based on the analysis. To find a solution to the issues jointly with the concerned municipality and the ward councillor, we presented the report to the concerned authority for further action.

Website Designing for the Calicut University

On realizing the need for a website for the NSS Department of Calicut University, our senior volunteers of B Sc Computer Science Ashitha. M, Sreeha Ravi, Sayandh. V and Akshay. K. 
Seven Day Special Camp Report 2015-16
